2022-23 Waterfowl Seasons and Bag Limits



Season	Dates	Daily Bag Limit
Youth Waterfowl Hunting Days*	October 29 - 30, 2022	Same as regular season.
Youth Hunters ages 12-15 accompanied by a properly licensed adult, 21 years of age or older.		
Canada Goose Early Season	September 1 - 30, 2022	15
Shooting hours are ½ hour before sunrise to ½ hour after sunset for the September season only.		
Canada Goose Regular Season	November 19 - 27, 2022 and December 3, 2022 - January 22, 2023	2
Permits and reservations are required to hunt the goose fields at the South Shore Management Area** in South Kingstown.		
Canada Goose Late Season	January 28, 2023 - February 11, 2023	5
CLOSED in Newport County, and portions of Washington County as described in RI Hunting Regulations § 9.11(B)(3)(d).		
Snow Geese (Inc. Blue Geese)	October 8, 2023 - January 22, 2023	25 No Poss. Limit
Brant	December 4, 2022 - January 22, 2023	2

Possession Limit: Three (3) times the Daily Bag Limit
(unless otherwise indicated)

*** Youth Waterfowl Hunting Days**
October 29 - 30, 2022

Youth hunters must be 12-15 years of age.

- May take ducks, sea ducks, geese, gallinules and brant following daily bag and possession limits for the regular seasons.
- Youth hunters shall hunt only in the immediate company of a qualified, licensed adult, 21 years of age or older.
- The accompanying adult(s) are prohibited from hunting on Youth Waterfowl Hunting Days.
- Youth hunters and accompanying adults must have current Rhode Island hunting licenses and H.I.P permits.
- Accompanying adult(s) must also possess valid state and federal waterfowl stamps.

**** South Shore Management Area**

- Permit available 24 hrs/day through the online licensing system or the DEM, Fish and Wildlife Great Swamp Field Office during normal business hours.
- Reservations are required to hunt the Canada Goose Regular Season.
- Reservation information available from the DEM Fish and Wildlife Great Swamp Field Office or on the website.
- Closed during the Canada Goose Late Season (January 28, 2023 - February 11, 2023).

Ducks	October 7 - 10, 2022 November 23 - 27, 2022 December 3, 2022 - January 22, 2023	6*
* The daily bag limit shall include no more than two (2) mallards of which one (1) may be a hen, three (3) wood ducks, two (2) redheads, two (2) black ducks, one (1) pintail, one (1) or two (2) scaup (see below), four (4) sea ducks (see below), and two (2) canvasbacks.		
Scaup	October 7 - 10, 2022, November 23 - 27, 2022, December 3, 2022 - January 2, 2023	1

Sea Ducks	Same As Ducks	4**
** The daily bag limit of sea ducks (4) is part of the daily duck bag limit of 6. The daily bag limit is 4, singly or in aggregate, but not to exceed 3 Scoter, 3 Eider (1 Hen), or 3 Long-tailed Ducks.

Possession Limit: Three (3) times the Daily Bag Limit.

2022-23 Waterfowl Regulation Highlights

- Sea Duck changes
 - » There is no longer a special sea duck season. The sea duck season is now the same as the duck season.
 - » Sea duck daily bag limit is now 4. Species restrictions include no more than 3 scoters, 3 eider (1 hen), and 3 long-tailed ducks.
 - » Sea ducks are now part of the daily duck bag of 6.
- There is no longer a special hooded merganser restriction on the merganser bag limit.
- Scaup remains split into two seasons;
 - » October 7 - 10, November 23 - 27, December 3 - January 2, 2023 with a daily bag limit of 1.
 - » January 3 - 22, 2023 with a daily bag limit of 2.
 - » The daily bag limit of scaup is part of the duck daily bag limit of 6.
- Shooting hours are ½ hour before sunrise to sunset unless otherwise noted in the regulations.
- Discharge of a firearm within 500 feet of an occupied dwelling is prohibited.
- Non-Toxic Shot Requirement: The possession of shells loaded with any shot other than non-toxic shot by any person hunting waterfowl, rails or snipe is prohibited.
- Cripples may be pursued, shot and retrieved from a boat under power in tidal waters seaward of the first upstream bridge; crippled birds must be immediately killed.
- Closed Areas: See regulations for a list and descriptions.

Waterfowl Stamp and H.I.P Permit

- All waterfowl hunters sixteen (16) years of age and older are required by law to purchase a Rhode Island Waterfowl Stamp as well as a Federal Migratory Bird Hunting and Conservation Stamp.
- State waterfowl stamp certifications issued through the web-based online licensing system need not be signed.
- Physical State Waterfowl Stamps obtained from the Division of Fish and Wildlife and Federal Ducks Stamps must be signed by the hunter across the face of the stamp and carried at all times when hunting.
- All migratory bird hunters, regardless of age must possess a current Harvest Information Program (H.I.P) Permit.
