

## 2021-2022 Washington Sport Fishing Rules Corrections and Updates

**UPDATED: April 25, 2022**

These corrections have been made to the online version of the regulations:

### **Page 31 (added July 12)**

An error was corrected for the Green (Duwamish) River – King Co. from an East-West line extending though the southernmost tip of Harbor Island to Tukwila International Blvd./Old Hwy. 99 CRC (746). The salmon season should read: Salmon Aug. 20-Dec. 31 Min. size 12". Daily limit 6. Up to 3 of any combination of chum and adult coho may be retained. Release Chinook.

### **Page 36 (added August 24)**

Clarifying language has been provided for the salmon seasons on the Nooksack River.

from Lummi Indian Reservation boundary to yellow marker at the FFA high school barn in Deming

Aug. 1 - Sept. 30: Min. size 12". Daily limit 4; to include not more than 2 hatchery Chinook or 2 wild coho or 1 of each. Release chum and wild Chinook.

Oct. 1 - Dec. 31: Min. size 12". Daily limit 4; to include not more than 2 Chinook or 2 wild coho or 1 of each. Release chum.

from yellow marker at the FFA high school barn in Deming to confluence of North and South forks

Oct. 1 - Dec. 31: Min. size 12". Daily limit 4; to include not more than 2 Chinook or 2 wild coho or 1 of each. Release chum.

### **Page 66 (added July 23)**

The Catch Record Card code was corrected for the Lewis River from mouth of the East Fork Lewis River to Johnson Creek. The correct code is 615, not 611.

### **Page 71 (added July 12)**

Sinlahekin Creek was omitted from the regulations. The entry should read: Sinlahekin Creek – Okanogon Co. from Palmer Lake to Cecile Creek Bridge, All game fish Sat. before Memorial Day-Aug. 31 Statewide min. size/daily limit. Whitefish Dec. 1-Last Day of Feb. Statewide min. size/daily limit.

### **Page 115 (added April 25)**

An error was corrected within the bottomfish rules for Marine Area 6 East of Juan de Fuca Strait. There is not an exception to bottomfish retention allowed for Pacific Cod in waters deeper than 120' on days open to halibut retention.
